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MESSAGE FROM THE HONOURABLE VICE CHANCELLOR

A very warm welcome to the students, who aspire to be a part of Cluster University of Srinagar from the academic session 2023-24!

The establishment of Cluster University in 2016 was an innovative and a strategic intervention in the higher education sector of JAK. The change was driven by the need to decongest the universities since the state universities were overburdened with hundreds of affiliated colleges. In this short span of time, Cluster University of Srinagar has carved a distinct identity by emerging as an important institution of higher learning.

Cluster University of Srinagar was created by pooling the resources of five existing colleges- Amar Singh College, SP College, Govt. College for Women, M. A. Road, Abdul Ahad Azad Memorial Degree College and Institute of Advanced Studies in Education (IASE). These five constituent colleges have adequate infrastructural facilities and they are all evolving in the form of advanced schools of learning. Besides, four colleges viz. GCET Safapora, GDC Allochi Bagh, GDC Hyderpora and GDC Eidgah are affiliated to Cluster University of Srinagar.

To act as an agent of change, I believe we need to have a special focus on skill development and creation of skilled workforce by undertaking industry oriented teaching, training and research, extension programmes and providing employable skills with a view to contribute to the development of the society. In this direction, we have been consistently floating skill and vocational courses to meet these objectives.

I firmly believe in establishing linkage with industry for promotion of science, technology, entrepreneurial skills, innovations, etc. and to adopt innovative methods to achieve the status of a self-reliant institution. Modern tools of e-learning have become integral part of the educational system at Cluster University of Srinagar. Innovative skill courses are being introduced with curriculum being designed as per the relevant needs of the industry.

We aim to improve the employability of our students keeping in consideration the demands of the highly competitive job market. Given the importance of co-curricular activities, we have constituted various centralized committees including the cultural and literary committee and the sports committee to ensure all-round development of students.

Cluster University of Srinagar has implemented the National Education Policy-2020 in letter and spirit from the academic year 2022-23 to lay the foundation of a robust system which caters to the changing demands of the world. The curriculum framework under NEP-2020 implemented at Cluster University of Srinagar is student centric; it ensures academic flexibility vis a vis selection of programmes of study from courses as diverse as major, minor, multidisciplinary, skill enhancement, value added and ability enhancement courses to harvest, in the best possible way, the potential of a student.

From the academic session 2023-24, the University has adopted the policy of single admission exam to its Undergraduate courses through Common University Entrance Test (CUET). The Cluster University of Srinagar along with Cluster University Jammu was created from the existing four to five Colleges located in close vicinity to each other. The infrastructure development of the cluster universities is funded through the Rashtriya Uchchattar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) scheme of the Ministry of Resources and Development (MHRD). Introduction Human development of cluster universities in Srinagar and Jammu have not only boosted the existing higher education facilities in J&K, but also helped to diversify the academics with the introduction of latest job-intensive courses at the graduate and post-graduate levels. CUS promotes cutting-edge research to create outstanding conditions for young scholars at universities, to deepen cooperation between disciplines and institutions, to strengthen national/ international cooperation between researchers. It serves as a platform for communication, collaboration and co-operation while optimizing scarce resources as well as freeing students from the autocracy of boundaries and the constraints of location using emergent IT tools. The concept combines the best in traditional systems with the new opportunities for knowledge enhancement. The plan has benefited all stakeholders with its targeted outcomes.


VISION AND MISSION


Vision

SRI PRATAP COLLEGE

School of Science



Sri Pratap College, the oldest and premier institute of higher education in Kashmir embodies a history of one hundred and seven years of its glorious past. It was established in the year with a modest roll of eight students and only six teachers.

The history of S.P. College is, in fact, the history of progress of higher education in Kashmir. For about the first half of the 20th century, S.P. College had the distinction of being the only institution to provide facilities for imparting higher education in Arts and Science disciplines in the valley. However, with the delinking of Arts stream from it in 1975, S.P. College is now an exclusively science college imparting science education at undergraduate level in a broad spectrum of subjects like Botany, Chemistry, Biochemistry, Zoology, Information Technology, Electronics, Physics, Mathematics and Statistics with as many as 37 subject combinations.

In a significant stride forward, the college started offering Post Graduate programmes in Environmental Science and Chemistry since 2003 affliating with the University of Kashmir. In the year 2017, the College offered Integrated P.G. courses affliating with the Cluster University of Srinagar. The college also started more P.G. level programmes in Botany, Zoology and Physics in 2018. In 2022, the College very significantly progressing towards a multidisciplinary arena implemented NEP 2020.

The college is on its way to broaden the entire spectrum of science education in the light of modern perspectives in education specified by NEP-2020 which is governing the entire education system today. In coherence with the National Education Policy, the college has proposed to start the emerging skill based courses like B.Sc. in Forensics and B.Sc. in Human Genetics which shall interest many students from the present generation and make a significant impact on the enhancement of employability of the youth.

ABDUL AHAD AZAD MEMORIAL DEGREE COLLEGE BEMINA, SRINAGAR

School of Social Science



Abdul Ahad Azad Memorial Degree College, Bemina, Srinagar (Erstwhile Govt. Degree College Bemina, Srinagar) was established in the year 1970 and the college started its academic operations in the year 1972. The college has the largest campus in the state, spread over an area of 283 kanals. Starting with an enrollment of a handful of students, the college has grown over the years to a whopping strength of more than 5500 students, thereby emerging as one of the biggest institutions of excellence in the state.

The institution was recognized by UGC under sections 2(f) and 12(B) shortly after its establishment and since then it was affiliated to the University of Kashmir, Srinagar and to Cluster University of Srinagar from 2017 after the establishment of Cluster University of Srinagar. The College has a lush green, pollution free and serene environment with large number of plantations, to make it an ideal place for teaching, learning and research activities.

INSTITUTE OF ADVANCED STUDIES IN EDUCATION, SRINAGAR GOVERNMENT COLLEGE OF EDUCATION

School of Education



This premier and historic institution started working with a humble beginning as a Teacher Training School established in 1937, promoted to Teachers Training College in 1948. The Institute was designated as Govt. College of Education in 1968. The team from MHRD visited the college in April, 2013 and gave recommendation for up gradation of the college to IASE. The Higher Education Department, Govt. of J&K issued orders for up gradation in August 2016 vide Govt. Order No: HE/UP-GRAD/COES/CSS2013/78 Dated: 04/03/2016 wherein the college was upgraded to INSTITUTE OF ADVANCED STUDIES IN EDUCATION (IASE). In 2016 there was a change in the affiliating University, the college is presently affiliated to Cluster University of Srinagar, and with its affiliation to Cluster University of Srinagar it was designated as "School of Education". The institution now aspires to be an autonomous University and has started working in that direction.

Besides teaching, the institution is imparting Orientation, Induction and Training, TOT courses for both School Teachers under Directorate of School Education and Assistant Professors from Higher Education Dept., J&K Govt. Educational administrators, ZRPs, CRPs, Teacher Educators. Training Programmes are organized Under Centrally Sponsored Teacher Education Scheme of MHRD. The institute has linkage with DSEK, SIE and DIET. The institution has a UGC Sponsored Women's Studies Centre established since 2006. The WSC carries out teaching, training and research projects. The college has a number of annual publications, Journal – INQUIRY (ISSN No-0974-8997), Magazine- Shame-Ferozan, IQAC- Newsletter, Research Compendium.

SHRI MOTI LAL SAQI (SMS) MEMORIAL GOVT. DEGREE COLLEGE, HYDERPORA SRINAGAR



Situated at a stone's throw from the Sheik ul Alam International Airport and at the crossroads of the major centres of the city, Sri Moti Lal Saki Memorial Government Degree College Hyderpora is ideally located to impart quality education to students far and wide. The college was established in the year 2019. The foundation stone of the institution was laid down by Shri K Skandan advisor to the then Governor Shri Satya Pal Malik on 4th March 2019 and is affiliated with Cluster University of Srinagar. Sri Moti Lal Saki Memorial Government Degree College Hyderpora imparts education in diverse streams such as Arts, Commerce and Science.

HAMIDI KASHMIRI MEMORIAL GOVT. DEGREE COLLEGE EIDGAH, SRINAGAR



Government Degree college Eidgah or Hamidi Kashmiri Memorial Government Degree College Eidgah Srinagar established in 2019 is still in its infancy stage. The college has been granted affiliation to 2 (f) of the UGC Act, 1956 vid file No: 8-34/2022 (CPP-I/C). The college is affiliated with Cluster University of Srinagar and enrolled its 1st batch of students in 2020. Though there is a paucity of space and infrastructure, there is no compromise as far as academics and the overall development of students is concerned. The College has been allotted 65.2 kanals of land at Saidpora Eidgah and various construction works are under way at Saidpora Eidgah. The total enrollment of the college is currently more than 400 with three academic batches in streams Arts, Commerce and Science.


GOVERNMENT COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING AND TECHNOLOGY (GCET), SAFAPORA



Government College of Engineering and Technology (GCET) Safapora Ganderbal is located near Manasbal Lake of District Ganderbal. The college has been established by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, under the centrally sponsored scheme Rashtriya Uchchattar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) for addressing the critical gaps in the spatial distribution of Higher Educational Institutions across the J&K.

GCET Safapora was initially operating from temporary accommodation provided at GDC Sumbal. The College shifted to its permanent campus in the year 2020. The construction work of permanent campus at Safapora is carried out by JKPCC and is under process. The new Campus of GCET Safapora is spread over 68 Kanals of land and is in process of developing its infrastructure. The College was inaugurated by Shri Ramesh Pokhriyal'Nishank', then Hon'ble Union Minister for Education, Government of India on 24 January, 2020.

SHRI MOTI LAL KEMU MEMORIAL GOVT. DEGREE COLLEGE, ALLOCHIBAGH



That Government Degree College Allochibagh was sanctioned by SAC vide Order No. 48-HE of 2019, dated 05-02-2019, which started functioning from a rented building at Madina Colony, Allochibagh from July 2019. The land measuring 34 Kanals (falling in and around Revenue Estate Barzulla) at Khadi Mill in Allochibagh Ground was identified by the Govt for the construction of this College. The College was inaugurated by Director Colleges Dr. Yaseen Ahmed Shah, Nodal Principal Dr. Yasmeen Ashai from rented accommodation and is is affiliated with the Cluster University Srinagar. Owing to non-availability of a permanent campus or any adequate rented building at Allochibagh, this College vide Order No: 294 JK HE of 2021, Dated: 28-09-2021 was temporarily shifted to the premises of erstwhile Govt Degree College Bagh-e-Dilawar Khan. As the creation of infrastructure is in process, the college is constantly pursuing its goals towards academic excellence. The college is pursuing to be a multidisciplinary institution with diverse streams and courses that may help students to achieve skills, leadership qualities, critical thinking and ethical values.

REGISTRATIONS AND ADMISSIONS TO UG PROGRAMMES

- 1. Candidates must read carefully the instructions (including how to fill up the application form online) given in the Information Bulletin available on the NTA Website: https://cuet.samarth.ac.in candidates not complying with the instructions shall be summarily disqualified.
- 2. Candidates can apply for CUET (UG) 2023 through the "Online" mode only. The application form in any other mode will not be accepted.
- 3. Submission of application form should be made by the candidate online through the NTA website: https://cuet.samarth.ac.in/
- 4. Instructions for filling online application form:
 - Download information bulletin and replica of application form. Read these carefully to ensure your eligibility.
 - Follow the steps given below to apply online:

STEP 1: REGISTRATION FORM

Register for the online application formand note down the system-generated application number. The candidate should provide the required details while filling the online application form and is also required to create PASSWORD and choose security question and enter his/her answer. After successful submission of the personal details, an application number will be generated and it will be used to complete the remaining steps of the application form and will also be required for all future reference/correspondence. For subsequent logins, the candidate will be able to login directly with the respective system-generated application number and created password.

STEP 2: APPLICATION FORM

The Candidates can log in with the system-generated application number and pre-created password for completing the application form including filling up personal details, providing the details of educational qualification, University / Institution / Organization and programme selection, test paper details, choosing the examination cities, and uploading the images and documents (if any).
