ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

University of Jammu is recognized as one of the premier institutions of the country and is accredited as A⁺ by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council of India (NAAC). It ranked 56th in University category under NIRF-2022. The University of Jammu has also been granted autonomy by the UGC and falls in Category-I in terms of this autonomy. It came into existence in 1969 vide Kashmir and Jammu Universities Act 1969 following bifurcation of the erstwhile University of Jammu and Kashmir by an ordinance promulgated by the Governor on September 5, 1969 and was subsequently adopted as an Act of the State Legislature.

Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir is the Chancellor of the University. Apart from its Main and Old Campus in Jammu, the University of Jammu also has eleven Offsite Campuses, out of which seven campuses located at Bhaderwah, Kathua, Kishtwar, Poonch, Ramnagar, Reasi and Udhampur are functional. Teaching-learning and research are being carried out by 43 departments and one hundred sixty three Govt. /Private affiliated Colleges.

The main campus of the University of Jammu is situated at Bahu Wali Rakh with an area of 118.78 acres, houses the Teaching Departments, Centres, Directorate of Sports and Physical Education, UGC-HRDC, Research Studies Wing, Administration Block, Examination Wing, College Development Council, Department of Students Welfare, Directorate of Distance Education, Dhanvantri Library, Publication Cell, Computer Centre, Health Centre, Guest House, Post Office, J&K Bank, Gymnasium, Hostels, Cafeteria and Canteens, Residential Quarters and many other facilities.

The old campus of the University of Jammu located at a distance of 4 km from the main campus, is spread over 10.5 acres and currently houses a hostel for boys and residential quarters for teaching and non-teaching employees. The University is truly treading the path of growth which is reflected in the developments over the past more than fifty years.

Introduction of new courses, establishment of new campuses, increase in the number of affiliated colleges, use of information Communication Technology (ICT), impetus to research, collaborations and infrastructural developments are the initiatives taken by the University of Jammu in the recent years

(A) SELECTION CRITERIA FOR ACHIEVEMENT CATEGORIES

Merit of the candidates applying under achievement categories of Sports/Cultural & Literary, and NCC/NSS/ Bharat Scouts and Guides activities shall be determined on the basis of composite score:

- (i) marks/points awarded to such a candidate for these activities, plus
- (ii) CUET Score

The composite score thus calculated, shall form the basis of admission,

PROVIDED that the candidate seeking admission has not been admitted to any programme of study in the University/College in an earlier session under the aforesaid reserved categories.

PROVIDED also, that where candidates have obtained equal composite score, the tie shall be resolved by reference to their achievement merit in the respective activity determined as per Statute. Higher achievement merit shall determined priority in admission.

- (i) A candidate applying for consideration under the achievement categories mentioned above must accumulate an achievement score of at least 8 (eight) points/marks.
